

Child Sexual Exploitation & Boys: Level 2

This one day **CPD accredited** course focuses specifically on boys and Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE), highlighting how to avoid stereotypes, myths and prejudices that might lead to underreporting of CSE in relation to boys and young men (BYM). The course also discusses risks specifically related to boys and shares learning from real-life examples, local evidence and national research, including serious case reviews, to help develop delegates' knowledge and practice.

Who is this course aimed at?

This course is aimed at professionals working in the third sector or public services that work with young people, either as victims or as offenders, or in another supportive capacity. This can include: *youth workers, the police, sexual health staff, school nurses.*

What this course covers:

- Definitions and different models of CSE and how this relates to BYM
- Vulnerability factors that put BYM more at risk – including addressing key points about BYM that may be underrepresented due to stereotyping
- The process of CSE, what is known about perpetrators and how they target and exploit young people - specifically relating to BYM
- The differences and similarities between the grooming of boys and girls
- Understanding how sexual orientation features in exploitative processes
- Best practice in responding to issues of CSE, based on lessons learned from experience, national policy and local guidance
- Exploring how to overcome stereotyping and barriers to engage with BYM
