

Level 2: Working with Women Sex Workers

Who is this course aimed at?

Sex Work Projects and third sector or statutory organisations that provide services to or work with sex workers (indoor and street). This could include: *Substance Abuse services, Health services (incl. mental health, sexual health, GPs and hospital staff), Police, Probation services, charities (women's, homelessness, health, DV, SV, substance abuse, criminal justice).*

What this course covers:

- The context of sex work in England
- Challenging myths and prejudices that sex workers face
- Laws governing sex work including different legal models
- Reasons for women's involvement in, and routes into, sex work
- Sex workers' experiences of safety, crime & violence
- Key issues affecting engagement with sex workers including trauma, stigma, coercion and DV, substance abuse, migration, health and housing including context, interrelationships and barriers to access
- Best practice principles & approaches for working with women involved in sex work
